## Walkers raise money for research

Among the hundreds of walkers wearing pink T-shirts at the 39-mile Avon Walk for Breast Cancer in New York City next month, six will be sporting the logo of Fairfield County exercise and fitness studios Go Figure.

The six walkers — four from the New Canaan studio and two from Greenwich — have logged hundreds of miles in training and have cumulatively raised more than \$18,000 in contributions to the Avon breast cancer initiative.

Their biggest single supporter, Go Figure founder and owner Cindy Sites, donated \$5,000 to Avon on behalf of the team, and contributions continue to roll in as more people learn about the fund-raising effort.

The New York Avon Walk for Breast Cancer is one of a series of similar events held in major cities around the country. This year's walk is Oct. 6 and 7, and will cover 39 miles around Manhattan and over the George

Washington Bridge into New Jersey. Money raised through the Avon Walks are managed by the Avon Foundation to advance access to care and finding a cure for breast cancer. It supports a virtual national network of research, medical, social service and community-based organizations.
